RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY THE SECURITY COUNCIL

Regarding Nuclear Regulation

The Security Council,

Expressing its appreciation to The International Atomic Energy Agency, whose Department of Nuclear Safety and Security works towards the protection of the environment, people, and society, and advocates for the safe use of nuclear technologies,

Expressing further appreciation to all the regions which are a part of the Nuclear-Weapons-Free-Zones and stand as an example to rid our global community of nuclear weaponry,

Deeply concerned with the greater availability of the use of nuclear weaponry for military purposes, due to the greater advances in nuclear research and testing,

Regarding with concern the steadily increasing dependency on nuclear plants for energy production, as 16% of all energy generated in 2016 was with using nuclear power, especially the building of 66 more nuclear reactors, to add onto the previously standing 444,

Mindful of the tension on the Korean Peninsula with nuclear testing and practice, which may be regarded as controversial when reflected with the goals of a more peaceful international community,

Noting with grave concern that the misuse of nuclear weaponry, breach in safety protocol of nuclear regulation, or improper handling of nuclear reactors may lead to a variety issues, including those of contamination of food resources, emission of radioactive material into the atmosphere, and destruction of infrastructure; such as those which led to disastrous catastrophes in Hiroshima and Nagasaki during the Second World War,

Noting with equally grave concern the terrible medical conditions inflicted on populations that experience exposure to nuclear radiation if there is a deliberate or accidental release of nuclear radiation, as exposure to high levels of nuclear radiation can cause radiation sickness and increase the risk of various cancers,

1. *Encourages* all nations not part of The Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT) to join, as a representation to the international community of our unity against possessing any nuclear materials for military or hostile use;
2. *Strongly condemns* all countries which partake in nuclear weapon testing to stop immediately and surrender all nuclear weapons to the UN to prevent them from being used for hostile purposes;
3. *Calls upon* all countries which possess any nuclear materials to contribute to a plan with the purpose to prevent nuclear disasters by:
 - (a) Contribute 0.2% of its GDP annually to inspect all sites which contain nuclear materials, including nuclear power plants;
 - (b) Increase the standards for the safety inspections of sites holding nuclear materials;
4. *Recommends* all countries to report any nuclear materials they may possess, regardless of their participation in The Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT);
5. *Strongly urges* all nations which largely rely on nuclear energy generation to limit their generation and reliance due to environmental and safety concerns.
